

Faustina's 'Divine Mercy Floodgates'



According to Faustina, God restrains his mercy every day of the year, except for one 24 hour period! According to Faustina's Diary (Paragraph 699): "On that day ['Divine Mercy Sunday' in the Novus Ordo calendar] the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy... ***On that day*** all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened." (emphasis added) Her writing thereby implies that at least some 'divine floodgates' are closed on other days – including Easter! – ridiculously implying that God is 'fully merciful' on just one day per year, the day traditionally called 'Low Sunday' [a day for which the esteemed Dom Gueranger stated that "no Feast, however great, can ever (!) be kept upon" this day].
